PASTOR'S CORNER

John Wesley's 22 Questions of Self-Examination

I've spent some time learning more about John Wesley through a United Methodist Doctrine class I attended this past July. I had the opportunity to read Wesley's sermons, journals, letters, and articles about him, and it was truly amazing to see the faithful legacy he left behind. Over 200 years ago, when John Wesley and his brother Charles were students at Oxford University, they started a small group that met regularly for prayer, Bible study, and discipleship. In their private devotional time, they used 22 questions to "methodically" examine their spiritual lives to encourage spiritual accountability in their faith and growth in their commitment to Christ. This was the beginning of the

Methodist movement.

John Wesley asked himself these questions every day to grow spiritually and recorded his answers in his journal. I encourage you to ask yourselves these questions every day to examine your faith.

- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give it time to speak to me every day?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
- 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly?
 - 22. Is Christ real to me?



2 tsp. ground cinnamon
